RV loses car, which heads into marsh

TENSTRIKE — As Pat Biggs and longtime boyfriend Loren McDougall began the trip from International Falls to Oregon in their large recreational vehicle on Wednesday, the small, two-door Pontiac hitched behind suddenly broke free and careened off U.S. Highway 71 and down a 50-foot ditch where it was slowed by a slough just south of Tenstrike. “I looked out the window and said, ‘Honey, I think that’s our car,’” Biggs had said from the passenger seat. “The car just zoomed right off a hitch and down the hill.” According to Jeff Lofgren of Southside Towing, that’s exactly what happened. The hitch, connecting the Pontiac’s rear end to the back of the RV, snapped free and ripped the small car’s rear bumper off in the process. The unmanned vehicle, now free of its tether, swung around and veered into the left, northbound lane of Highway 71 and down a steep embankment. The car crashed through a barbed wire fence and found itself headlights-first in a small pond. No cars were traveling in the northbound lane when the accident occurred. “We were very lucky that there were no cars in the other lane or people on the side of the road when it happened,” Biggs said, as she patiently waited and snacked on a cracker. “I’m glad no one was hurt.” The disengaged bumper lay near the door of McDougall’s RV, which he had pulled onto the shoulder across from where the car stopped nearly a football field away. While Biggs waited near the bumper, snack in hand, Southside Towing of Bemidji attempted to remove the car from the wet, marshy land by running its cable from the top of the hill. “We were very lucky,” Biggs repeated. According to Beltrami County, no law enforcement officials had been called as of early Wednesday evening.

**FD: Apache Junction man suffers second, third degree burns in motorhome fire**

APACHE JUNCTION, AZ - A man was taken to the hospital in serious condition after a stove-top fire engulfed his motorhome Wednesday night.  
Apache Junction Fire Chief Dave Montgomery said the fire erupted around 5:30 p.m. near Superstition Boulevard and Ironwood Drive. The 57-year-old man said he was cooking with grease when the fire started. The man told authorities he tried, but was unable to extinguish the fire.  
Witnesses told authorities they saw the man leave the RV with smoke and fire bellowing behind him.  
Montgomery said the man had second and third degree burns covering most of his upper body. He was airlifted to Maricopa County Burn Center in serious condition.  
Officials say the motorhome was completely destroyed.



**Campground reopens after wolf attack**

BEMIDJI — The campground where 16-year-old Noah Graham was attacked by a wolf last weekend was again open for business Wednesday. Ann Long-Voelkner, a spokesperson for the Chippewa National Forest, said the West Winnie Campground at Lake Winibigoshish reopened Wednesday afternoon. Several campers had reservations, Long-Voelkner said. "It's a good thing that campers can come out and enjoy the campground for the holiday weekend," she said. The campground had been closed since Saturday morning when Graham, of Solway, was attacked by a 75-pound gray wolf, according to officials with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. The wolf was eventually captured and killed, and the results of a necropsy to be performed at the University of Minnesota are pending. Several officials with the DNR could not be reached for comment Wednesday. The attack made headlines across the state, and the nation, as one of a small number of wolf attacks. A preliminary study of the wolf's carcass showed it had a misaligned jaw, suggesting it may have had difficulty catching large prey.
