# Join us at Hoodsport, Washington

## May 16 - 19

It's time again for our relaxed weekend in Hoodsport Washington at the Rest-A-While RV Resort on the Hood Canal. This area is wonderful to visit. On a nice day, you can enjoy the beaches, lakes, and National Park in the area. Port Townsend and Port Angeles are also a nice drive. There is a lot of fun GeoCaching in the area and the small town of Hoodsport has fun shops to see. We always seem to relax and have a fun time at this one. This park does not require us to prepay for our sites. We will need the \$10.00 rally fee, but you will pay for your site when you check into the park. They are normally available for extra days, just let me know when you want to come in and leave. The maximum rate is \$38.00 plus tax. They accept credit cards, but offer a discount for Cash or Check. If we have enough coaches registered, we will receive a discount. I will let you know what to expect before you arrive. There are motel rooms available not far from this park if some of our non-camping members are interested. All sites are Full Hook Up with 30-amp service. A few 50-amp sites are available on a first-come basis.

We normally have a Friday and Saturday food fest in our club house, as well as breakfast on Sunday before we leave. I will finalize plans closer to the weekend.

The rally fee and deposit to hold your reservation is \$10 (refundable for cancellation made 14 days prior to reserved arrival date). You will pay your camping fees to Rest-a-While at check in.



# *FMCA's 88th Family Reunion and Motorhome Showcase*



## 2013: Big Birthday, Big Budget Woes for WA State Parks

ELMA, Wash. - The Washington State Parks system has its 100th birthday this year, and park workers are hoping the occasion will help rally public support.

The future of 116 state parks is up in the air, with budget cuts that already have eliminated some jobs, shifted full-time workers to part-time and left a maintenance backlog of \$100 million.

Gov. Chris Gregoire has recommended \$19 million from the General Fund to shore up the parks. Without that funding, predictions are grim, says Brian Yearout, president of the Washington Federation of State Employees Local 1466, the union that represents the park workers.

"What they've said is that you can't just close parks. It would have to be a combination of park closures, seasonal closures, campground closures, reduction in services. The initial numbers they're rolling out are between 40 and 70 parks would have to close."

Yearout says state parks boost local economies by attracting visitors and by using local workers for construction and maintenance. The state park system maintains more than 700 historic structures as well as trail systems, campsites, and boat ramps, he says.

It will be up to the Legislature to decide whether to accept the governor's recommendation.

State parks have gotten some funding from the Discover Pass, a user fee created in 2011 to replace revenue lost to budget cuts, but Yearout says it hasn't taken off the way they had hoped.

"I don't think we ever imagined it would be quite this bad - but we probably should have. But what we didn't take into account is that a program like this takes two, three, sometimes four seasons to stabilize and get to a level where you can actually project, year after year, what that revenue stream's going to be."

State parks receive 84 percent of the Discover Pass revenue, and 17 "friends" groups help with maintenance and fundraising for certain parks around the state. Volunteers already put in an estimated 280,000 hours a year for the park system. Those park-system "friends" groups are listed online at [parks.wa.gov/volunteers/friends](http://parks.wa.gov/volunteers/friends).

## **Michelin Advantage Tire Program**

Barbara and I, on our way back to the North Country, stopped in Eugene to take advantage of the FMCA Michelin tire program. If you aren't aware of it, FMCA has partnered with Michelin in order to gain a price advantage on tires for your coach. My experience backs up the claim of substantial savings on tire purchases and using the program is easy as 1-2-3.

First, you need to determine the size of tires you need. All sizes might not be available on the program and passenger tires are excluded. You then find your nearest Michelin RV tire dealer at [www.michelinrvtires.com](http://www.michelinrvtires.com) by entering your zip code in the dealer locator.

Next, you call the dealer to check availability and to make sure they handle national accounts for the Michelin Advantage Program. Tell the dealer you will be purchasing tires through FMCA's Advantage Account and the account number is 1326516. The dealer should give you an estimate on the price at this time. You can find prices here <http://www.fmca.com/images/stories/pdf/michelin-prices.pdf>. (This list is a year or so old, but I paid the price listed on it.) The actual price that you pay will be on the invoice that you receive from FMCA in a few days via email. It should be noted that any fees for mounting, balancing, state and local taxes and tire disposal are extra and are quoted by the tire dealer.

Schedule an appointment with the dealer and review your order and review any extra services you might need such as balancing.

This next step makes some people queasy, as you will be pre-registering your credit card info

directly to Michelin as you are purchasing tires directly from them through a dealer. Michelin accepts Visa, MasterCard, and American Express cards only. To pre-register, contact the Michelin Advantage Program at (888) 532-6435. Your card information will remain on file for 30 days and is set to be used one time only. You can make another purchase, but the card has to be registered again.

At the time of purchase, you will provide the dealer with the name on the credit card, the first digit, the last four digits and the expiration date of the card that you pre-registered. Michelin will bill your credit card so don't be surprised if the invoice you get from the dealer has a zero balance. Your credit card will be billed the discounted price and not the inflated price.

Provide the dealer with your FMCA membership number and your email address. Providing your membership number and email address will ensure that you receive your invoice from FMCA. You should receive your invoice within seven business days from the date of purchase.

It really went this smoothly for us. At the recommendation of a friend, we used Superior Tire Service, 33960 Old Willamette Hwy, Eugene, OR 97405. Their phone number is: (541) 744-2000.

We purchased four tires for the drive axle and figure we saved almost \$500 compared to the other tire dealer in Junction City. Our four tires cost \$2700 plus \$146 for installation. We pulled in at 10:45 and were out by noon. Service was excellent, the staff was friendly and they used a torque wrench. Our invoice from FMCA appeared in our email the next morning with the exact pricing quoted.



## Top 10 Beachside RV Parks in the U.S.

It's time to start thinking about planning a [road trip](#) in your RV. With so many beautiful beaches across our nation, there are lots of spectacular places to park your recreational vehicle with the ocean as the backdrop. Here is a look at 10 of the best.

### **Kalaloch: Southwest Coast of Washington State**

[Kalaloch](#) sits on the edge of a bluff overlooking the Pacific in the Olympic National Park. It's open year-round, but the best time to visit is in the summer. This is the only RV park/campground on the south coast with direct beach access, so you'll need to make reservations in advance if you visit from June through September. There are 175 sites with a 21-foot recommended RV length.

Kalaloch is known for its wide sandy beach with beautiful pieces of driftwood and shells to discover. It's located directly off Highway 101, 5.6 miles north of Queets, Washington.

### **Depoe Bay, Oregon**

Depoe Bay, Oregon, on the central coast of the state, is home to [Sea and Sand RV Park](#), directly off Highway 101 between Newport and Lincoln City. You'll be rewarded with magnificent ocean views from terraced ocean RV sites and seven miles of white sand filled with treasures such as agates, shells, and even Japanese floats. Gray whales are often spotted right from the shore, so be sure to bring your binoculars for a close-up view of the majestic creatures. All spaces have electric, cable, water, sewer, and include free Wi-Fi access.

### **Shelter Cove, California**

Heading further south into northern California between Fort Bragg and Eureka, you'll find one of the best-kept secrets of the Golden State. The area is called "The Lost Coast," and Shelter Cove is set in a remote area just west of the beautiful redwoods. The [Shelter Cove RV park and campground](#) offers pristine ocean views with secluded beaches, and visitors can enjoy the region year-round, with spring and fall usually the best time to explore.

### **Newport Beach, California**

Southern California visitors should consider [Newport Dunes RV Waterfront Resort and Marina](#). It offers a mile of sandy beachfront and ocean swimming. The 110-acre resort is located in Newport at the entrance to the Back Bay Nature Preserve. Sailboat rentals and a variety of outdoor activities can be found here. Winter brings slightly cooler and rainier weather, but the rest of the year often brings ideal temperatures.

### **South Padre Island, Texas**

South Padre Island is located on the tropical tip of Texas, bordered by the Gulf of Mexico and the Laguna Madre Bay, offering a wealth of fun in the sun on its beautiful beaches and the warm waters of the Gulf. [KOA South Padre Island](#) is located just off SR 100, and RV sites offer 50-amp service with Wi-Fi included.

You'll be rewarded with spectacular views of the water, and you might even glimpse a dolphin or two playing in the waves. You can visit here year-round, but keep in mind that June through November is hurricane season.

### **Big Pine Key, Florida**

The Florida Keys have a Caribbean feel without having to leave the states. The [Sunshine Key RV Resort and Marina](#) offers a tropical environment on a 75-acre island at the ocean's edge. Take a dip in the heated outdoor [swimming pool](#) and enjoy sites with 30- to 50-amp service. The resort even offers tennis, basketball, and shuffleboard courts. The Keys are best experienced during winter and spring, but can be enjoyed year-round.

### **Myrtle Beach, South Carolina**

Oceanfront RV sites are located at the 200-acre [Lakewood Camping Resort](#) in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, and it includes a half-mile of sandy beach. It's located on the south end of town and was recently named the best RV park in the state. The resort offers full hook-up sites with 20- to 50-amp service and is open from April 1-September 30.

### **The Outer Banks, North Carolina**

[Camp Hatteras RV Resort and Campground](#) is located on Hatteras Island in the historic village of Rodanthe, North Carolina. Full hook-up sites are available at the edge of the Atlantic Ocean or the tranquil Pamlico Sound. Here guests can relax in the sand and sun, go beach combing, or play in the water. It includes five-star resort amenities with an indoor heated pool and Jacuzzi. The resort is open year-round, but spring and fall are the best times to experience the Outer Banks region.

### **Cape Cod, Massachusetts**

If New England is more your style, consider [Ocean View Cape Cod](#), Cape Cod's only oceanfront RV resort. There are 140 RV sites that come fully equipped with water, electricity, sewer, and cable TV connections, and they can accommodate motor homes up to 32 feet in length. Six hundred feet of private ocean beach is available to all guests. The park is open from May through October.

### **Southport, Maine**

At [Gray Homestead](#) in Southport, Maine, you'll find the only oceanfront campground in the Boothbay Harbor region, about an hour northeast of Portland, Maine. You'll be rewarded with spectacular ocean views in a peaceful setting with 40 RV sites available, including 20- to 30-amp service. Lobstering is available right on the pier with facilities available to cook your own, or you can even ask the park host to arrange to have your lobster cooked for you. You'll find the sea shores of Maine best in the summer.
