You will also find several interesting antique shops up and down the peninsula and dining opportunities from fast to gourmet foods. Drive a few short miles south to Ilwaco for the Street Art Walk along the sea wall behind the fishing fleet for a picturesque walk among local arts and crafts. You are bound to find a memorable treasure to add to your motorhome. You can also buy fresh fish right off the boat at the local fishery at the end of the boardwalk.



AMISH BREAKFAST CASSEROLE



- Amish Breakfast Casserole Recipe and photo published by: Taste of Home.

- ◆ Prep: 15 min. Bake: 35 min. + standing
- ◆ Yield: 12 Servings

Ingredients

- ◆ 1 pound sliced bacon, diced
- ◆ 1 medium sweet onion, chopped
- ◆ 6 eggs, lightly beaten
- ◆ 4 cups frozen shredded hash brown potatoes, thawed
- ◆ 2 cups (8 ounces) shredded cheddar cheese
- ◆ 1-1/2 cups (12 ounces) 4% cottage cheese
- ◆ 1-1/4 cups shredded Swiss cheese

Directions

- ◆ In a large skillet, cook bacon and onion until bacon is crisp; drain. In a large bowl, combine the remaining ingredients; stir in bacon mixture. Transfer to a greased 13-in. x 9-in. baking dish.
- ◆ Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 35-40 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Let stand for 10 minutes before cutting. **Yield:** 12 servings.



SARAH'S DEVILED EGGS

The recipe...actually, there isn't one. I just scoop out some mayo, mustard, relish, salt & pepper....nothing is measured. The real difference is I add some Wasabi mayo...about 1/4 the amount of the regular mayo. That gives it just a bit of a kick. I mix that all together and stir it in with the yolks of the boiled eggs and fill the egg cups. It always seems to be well received. Sarah Gabel

Ingredients

- ◆ 10 oz pkg chopped broccoli (thawed)
- ◆ 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- ◆ 1 box Jiffy cornbread mix
- ◆ 1 stick butter
- ◆ 1 small chopped onion
- ◆ 4 beaten eggs

Directions

Heat oven to 350°. Melt butter in 13x9x2 Pyrex dish. In a large bowl, beat the eggs, mix in cornbread mix and then stir in onion, cheese and broccoli. Pour into the Pyrex dish. Pat mixture into corners and level. Bake 45 minutes (25 minutes in a convection oven).



FMCA's 88th Family Reunion and Motorhome Showcase




their CC. Randy was a Police/Fire helicopter pilot with the California parks. He is active in the Military Vehicle


What's going on with David and Karen Roberts?
