At the Flower-in-Bloom rally in preparation for the 2016 Northwest Rally in Linn County, we had a short informal meeting to discuss volunteering. The consensus was that the club would support volunteering. This information was provided to Don Schleuse for inclusion in the planning for that Rally and to the Rally hosts of the McMinnville Pre-Rally.

The Stoneridge Rally in Blanchard, ID, is coming up June 11 to 14. John and Cathy Lamb are hosting this Rally. Blanchard is an unincorporated census-designated place in Bonner County, Idaho, United States. Blanchard is located on Idaho State Highway 41. Both Coeur d'Alene (33 miles) and Spokane (51 miles) are close by.

The Loop encircles the breathtaking Selkirk Mountains in northeast Washington, north Idaho and southeast British Columbia, a place of forested hillsides, sparkling waterfalls, snowcapped craggy peaks and charming small towns. Within the Loop, the Selkirk Mountains are accessible from the Salmo Basin, Sullivan Lake, Priest Lake, Pack River, Roman Nose, Kootenay Pass and Kokanee Glacier recreation areas.

The club has no rallies in July and August.

We have a rally in September at Casey's in Westfir, OR. I plan to hold the annual meeting at this event. This year, we will need to elect a President, Vice President and Treasurer. Dana (Treasurer) and I (President) are willing to serve another term if the club wants us to. That would be our last term for a while. # TACO SOUP

## Ingredients:

1 lb. ground beef, browned and drained (onions may be browned with meat, but I leave mine raw)

28-oz. can crushed tomatoes

15-1/4-oz can whole kernel corn, undrained

15-oz can black beans, undrained

15-1/2-oz can red kidney beans, undrained

7-oz can mild green chiles, undrained (optional/Not in the Rally soup)

1-2 envelopes dry Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing mix

1-2 envelopes dry taco seasoning (to taste)

1 small-medium onion, chopped

Tortilla chips or Fritos

Shredded Cheddar

Sour cream

Instructions: Combine all ingredients except chips, shredded cheese and sour cream in a slow cooker.

Cover. Cook on LOW 4-6 hours

Serve with chips, cheese, and sour cream as desired.

NOTE: Fresh Anaheim, Poblano (Ancho) Chiles may be added as an option

# MEMBERS' CORNER

## *Adventures In Boondocking*

Our first night out on our four-month adventure to the Canadian Maritime Provinces and we decided to boondock at the Stateline Walmart Store in Post Falls, ID. We got in about 5:00 pm and parked on the asphalt near the end of the building where the summer landscaping merchandise had not been stocked yet. We were at the very end of the store, away from the main entrance, and not a stone's throw from a large gravel parking area for trucks and RVs. We did a little shopping in the store, walked the dogs and turned in relatively early. At 5:00 am, we hear a knock, knock, knock at the coach door. I got dressed and peered out the window to find two police officers at our door and my mind goes immediately to: What did I do? Man, was I wrong!

I looked out at a sea of police cruisers, sheriff's canine units, an Army surplus armored personnel carrier and dozens of law enforcement personnel in riot/camouflage/plain clothes carrying assault rifles and other weapons. I immediately thought of Alice's Restaurant with all the cop equipment showing up, but it turned out to be much more! We were literally surrounded by law enforcement officers and equipment and some of them were spreading evidence tape around the bulk of the Walmart parking lot and we were right in the middle of it all. Turns out a dedicated career Coeur d' Alene police officer stopped a possible burglar about 2 am and was shot and the suspect took off in the officer's law enforcement vehicle. A neighbor heard the shots, saw the officer lying in the street and called 911. The suspect abandoned the vehicle in the Walmart parking lot with other law enforcement vehicles arriving shortly thereafter. Michele was awake just after 2 am and heard one person outside our coach say to another: "You can't stay here."

When the two police officers asked us if we had heard anything during the night, they had already discovered and apprehended a suspect who was hiding among the rear axles of a nearby semi. I need to give much credit to their canine "officer" who discovered the suspect. They sadly also told us the police officer that was shot was receiving emergency medical care, but probably not going to make it, and that turned out to be true. The investigators spent quite a bit of time around our coach looking for an abandoned firearm, even climbing onto our roof. A friend of ours lives nearby and was coming over for a visit, but the detectives were not willing to let outsiders into the scene so we met him in the Walmart. We were able to pack up and leave about 9 am when they had finished with their evidence collection.

Thoughts and lessons learned: We were certainly at ground zero where this all unfolded. When the knock on our door happened at 5 am, I peered out the window without opening the door—a good thing since it could have been the suspect. I believe the suspect was looking for an opportunity to get away and may well have decided we could have provided the cover for that. I suspect that our attached toad, slides out and jacks down "may" have been a deterrent, or it just could have been timing with law enforcement in hot pursuit. I was glad we were camped in a well-lit location, not where the trucks were parked that was much darker. I slept through the 2 am conversation Michele heard, but wish she had awakened me. We were simply in the wrong place at the wrong time. It was an adventure in boondocking.

## **Kubas survive Oklahoma tornado**

*[Excerpt] Despite broken bones, deep cuts and bruises, Ed and Helen Kuba said they're simply grateful they're alive. The former Alexandria residents were in an Oklahoma City (OKC) RV park when a tornado hit May 6 and destroyed their RV while they were inside. Both were seriously injured, hospitalized and released over the weekend. It was very, very, very scary and we're both very lucky," Helen told the Echo Press Monday. At least a dozen people in the RV park were injured, according to NBC News.*

**WHAT HAPPENED:** *The Kubas had just wrapped up a visit with one of their daughters in Austin, Texas, and they were on their way north to visit their other daughter in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and eventually head back to Minnesota. They decided to stop and spend Wednesday night at Roadrunner RV Park in OKC. The stormy weather had moved in, tornado sirens were blaring and the Kubas were headed for the storm shelter, but the sirens stopped and people were leaving the shelter. "We decided not to go," Ed said. The sirens started again and they were about to head to the shelter again when they looked out the front windshield of the coach and saw a trailer fly by. They hunkered down inside their RV. "I can remember getting hit in my face and thinking, 'Well, that's not good.' Then, I got hit in the chest and thought, 'That's not good yet.' I don't know if I was knocked out or not," Ed recalled. "We think the motorhome went to one side. ... It went down and hit the ground on the slide-out side and maybe went over and hit the other side too because there was dirt and sod on the wheels, up in the doors. Then, it ended back upright," he said. Helen ended up in the stairwell, wedged next to the door. Ed said, then, they just waited. "People were walking around with flashlights, and I yelled to them, 'There are two in here.' Then, the firemen came. Both were taken to a nearby hospital. Helen, 78, has a broken sternum, fractured vertebrae, a laceration on her head, a lot of bruises, contusions and scrapes. Ed, 79, suffered a laceration on his leg, a cracked rib, cuts under one eye and above the other and bruises. "It's hard to explain just what happened," Ed said. "We're just very lucky. Somebody sure was with us. We're very thankful to be alive," he said.*
