

Winnebago to open plant in Junction City, revive Country Coach brand December 1, 2015

... "We are pleased to be expanding our operations and look forward to the increased production and service presence this new facility will provide on the west coast," said Scott Degnan, Winnebago's Vice President of Sales and Product Management. "We would also like to express our thanks to Ron Lee, the former owner of the facilities, for providing us with this opportunity."


Country Coach, part of Junction City's past, is now part of Winnebago's future, Degnan said.

"As part of the facility purchase, Winnebago also acquired the intellectual property rights associated with Country Coach and we intend to revive that brand as part of the planned use of the new facility," he said.

Winnebago entered into an agreement on November 18, 2015, with the Lee Joint Trust to purchase property adjacent to the facility which was part of the Country Coach operation in the past.

"We have begun our due diligence evaluation of the property and hope to have that completed in the near future," said Scott Folkers, Winnebago's Vice President and General Counsel said. "We anticipate using this property to provide ongoing customer service to Country Coach owners, as well as providing service to Winnebago owners."

Brent was born in Wasco, California, where his parents enjoyed going to the race track and took him there as he grew up, creating in him a major love of all things "Racing." Marilyn's family moved from Iowa to California in 1960. After moving to Santa Ana, California, Marilyn and Brent met as Juniors in High School. They have been involved with racing, Corvettes and motorhomes most of their married life. They celebrated their 45th Wedding Anniversary on May 29, 2015. After each trip, the coach had to have major repairs, so they traded it for a new 36-ft. Hawkins Motor Coach in 1986. The factory was closer to home, but it rarely needed repairs! They also joined the newly formed HMC Club and remain in touch with friends they met in that club. They sold the HMC in 1990 when they ordered a 40-ft. Beaver Marquis. At that time, they enjoyed running a Southwest Tour Car in a NASCAR series and had an experienced driver in the car.

In 2002, Brent caught the "Corvette bug" and purchased a new 2003 Electron Blue Z06. More involvement in their Corvette Club and work took them away from having a motorhome for a few years. In 2008, the "motorhome bug" had them purchasing a 2001 45-ft. Prevost Bus and they towed either their Avalanche or the race car trailer for Brent's racing Corvette T-1.

They sold the motorhome in 2010 when Brent stopped racing and was busy opening his new CPA Firm. Since moving to Allyn, Washington, in 2013, he is "tele-commuting" with the office in California and working from home.



Looking toward retirement, they decided to move back into the RV world. Knowing the quality of Country Coach, they found a 2007 37-ft. Country Coach Allure for sale at the Factory in Junction City, Oregon. They made a deposit, drove home, bought a Jeep to tow, loaded the Jeep with bedding, towels, kitchen utensils, clothes, etc., and drove back to Country Coach to purchase the Coach on September 15, 2015. They then headed to Southern California so Brent

could help at the Firm and returned home on November 2, after leaving the Coach at the Factory for a few things to be serviced and updated. They picked up the Coach at Junction City and drove to their first Rally with the NorthWest Country Coachers on November 25. They feel very fortunate to have made many lifetime friendships with fellow motorhome club members and look forward to meeting NWCCers at the rallies!

RV/MH Hall of Fame & Museum

I suspect if you who have been "Rving" for any length of time you have heard of the RV/Motorhome Hall of Fame & Museum. Every RV-related magazine has done articles on the informative place. You can see the large building and outside displays from the freeway. The exhibits are quite interesting, especially to those who like RV nostalgia. There is a lot of history under one roof. But, after reading more on the facility's web site about the

organization's financial challenges, I understand why the exhibit's floor space is not being expanded. There is a Library & Archives containing thousands of periodicals, records and photos pertaining to the RV/MH industry that is available for use by anybody interested. There is a portrait wall of individuals who have been leaders in the RV Industry. A listing of these individuals and their accomplishments is available on their web site. Country Coach Founder, Bob Lee, was nominated to the Hall of Fame in 2000. A search of the Hall of Fame directory will yield the article on Bob's affiliations and accomplishments as an RVIA member. 

NEW APP HELPS RVERS AVOID LOW CLEARANCES

CHICAGO — LowClearances.com has released a newly updated product to help drivers avoid low clearances.

Route-1 is a database of more than 5,000 low clearances on major and minor roads in the United States and Canada. It works with popular low-cost GPS and mapping systems such as Garmin, TomTom, Rand McNally, MapSource, Google Earth, Microsoft Streets & Trips, and BaseCamp. It is also compatible with iOS & Android devices (TomTom & Google Earth Apps only).

With the Route-1 POI database installed, a driver's GPS system will issue an audible warning for a low clearance on the route ahead. The height is shown on the screen, allowing the driver to continue or take an alternative route that avoids the height restriction.

The alerts can be set to trigger miles ahead of the potential hazard, giving the driver ample time to take any necessary diversion to avoid the hazard. The driver can opt to receive alerts for all low clearances whatever their height, or only for the ones that are lower than the height of the vehicle.

The task of planning and checking a safe route is simplified, with any low clearances on the route shown clearly in the mapping software or on the GPS map display before departure. If the driver is diverted away from the pre-planned route, the GPS will automatically work out a new route and continue to issue clearance alerts to the driver.


"Professional drivers have an extensive knowledge of low clearance locations and plan their routes carefully to avoid problems. But if drivers are diverted onto unfamiliar roads, they need a backup system to protect themselves and the vehicle, not to mention any low clearances that may be encountered," said Jon Mills, the product developer.

"Every year there are hundreds of bridge strikes in the United States and the trend is rising as traffic volumes increase. What truck and large RV drivers need is a simple and low cost countermeasure, which is possible using modern mapping and GPS technology," he added.

Drivers can purchase the 'Route-1' POI database from LowClearances.com

Route-1 is a live resource that is regularly updated to improve coverage, and users can download the latest release at any time.
