Southern Oregon Rally

July 25-28, 2016

Spaces for the Southern Oregon (Ashland) Rally are filling up fast, so if you are planning to attend, please send in your registration with payment and register with Holiday RV Park as soon as possible.

You may not know that the Oregon Shakespeare Festival was founded by Angus Bowmer in 1935. The Festival presents 11 plays in an eight-month season, which include works by Shakespeare as well as a mix of classics, musicals and new works. It draws attendance of more than 400,000 to almost 800 performances every year and employs approximately 575 theatre professionals. Additionally, there are several hundred local volunteers who help to make this theatre what it is today. We are fortunate to have this gem in Oregon!

There are three theatres on the OSF campus: The Bowmer Theatre, which seats 600 people indoors; the Thomas Theatre—an intimate theatre seating up to 368; and the Allen Elizabethan Theatre, which is a 1200-seat outdoor venue. Our group will be attending **THE WIZ** in the outdoor Allen Elizabethan Theatre. This adaptation of **THE WIZARD OF OZ** is an uproarious, song-filled story told through the lens of the African-American experience. It won seven Tony Awards and had a four-year run on Broadway. Information about all 11 of the 2016 plays can be found on the OSF website: osfashland.org. You might want to extend your visit in Ashland and see more plays.

While in Southern Oregon, you can take advantage of the many local attractions, such as great restaurants, river rafting and fishing, winery tours, shopping, etc. If you are interested in golf, let us know and we can get you set up with that.

Stay in the Heart of Tucson at All New Sentinel RV Park

If you've ever wondered why [Tucson's RV parks](#) are all located on the fringes of town, it's because until recently no RV parks had been built within city limits. Thankfully that's changed because of Todd Spencer, the visionary owner of the all new [Sentinel Peak RV Park](#) in Downtown Tucson.

Meet Tucson's Newest RV Park

[Sentinel Peak RV Park](#) is located just west of Interstate 10 on Grande Avenue at St. Mary's. The park is situated in the heart of Tucson's best attractions. Whether you drive, bike, jump on the light rail or ride in Sentinel's free guest shuttle van you're within three minutes of the artsy 4th Avenue district, the newly revamped \$400-million dollar Downtown, the Tucson Convention Center and of course the University of Arizona. No other Tucson RV park puts you in touch with the community the way Sentinel does.

The two-acre parcel where Sentinel sits is the longtime dream of Todd Spencer, a Tucson local with a career in hospitality construction and part of an active RVing family. Three years ago when he saw that vacant patch of land he knew it was the perfect spot to build a park. His own RV adventures were always more fun when his family could be near a destination's best attractions and he wanted to bring that experience to RVers who come to Tucson.

"We realized there weren't a lot of locations where people were close to the action, close to the arts and entertainment where they could get out and do things," he said. That's when inspiration hit him.

"We all sit around the campfire and tell stories," he explains, "But the stories don't usually go 'Yeah that place had level sites and it was awesome!' Sometimes they do, but usually people are saying 'You won't believe what we did. You won't believe what we saw!' That's what intrigued me about building here.

"The idea of hospitality and lodging isn't a new concept for me," he explains. Spencer's 20-year span managing new construction for major hotel chains like Ritz Carlton, Marriott and Hilton prepared him well for creating a park within Tucson city limits. "We literally wrote the book on how to build an urban RV park in Tucson," he said.

In November 2015 after many city meetings and neighborhood presentations, Spencer's 22-site park finally came online. His three-year construction project paid off and he boldly opened in time for snowbird season. The park has been booked since opening day and is receiving rave reviews on websites like [RVParkReviews.com](#).

The [Annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally](#) in the Black Hills of South Dakota is a mandatory bucket list item for thousands of bikers from all walks of life, and with good reason.

Each year close to a half-million biker enthusiasts make their way to party, ride and race in this small South Dakota outpost that earns close to 95% of its annual revenue during the event's two week-long stint in August. RVing to Sturgis is the ideal way to go; with the right setup you can haul your bikes and bring all the comforts of home.

History of the Sturgis Bike Rally


The "[Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club](#)" kicked off the first Sturgis rally in 1938 as the "Black Hills Classic," a simple racing event for just nine local motorcyclists. Over 78 years later the club is still going strong and owns the lighted short track, motocross track, field meet area, hillclimb area, clubhouse, office and a concession business were much of the Sturgis rally takes place. The Jackpine Gypsies hold over a dozen events during the rally.

Today, Sturgis attendees are a mix of riders from all walks of life.

Where to Stay and What to Do in Sturgis

Sturgis officials estimate that less than half of participants who attend the annual event actually ride the entire way. Many RVers will tow their bikes behind their rigs and ride once they get there. If you're doing the same you'll be in great company. In the iRV2 Discussion Forums you'll find dozens of tips and tricks from Sturgis RVing bikers, like [jeryan59](#):

If you've always wanted to experience a "Bikers Only" attitude and ambiance, the Sturgis Rally is a must. During the first weeks in August over four blocks in Sturgis are designated just for bikers and highways are jammed with two-wheeled riders. But seasoned Sturgis RVing veterans know that there's so much more to do than just attend the Sturgis parties, concerts and motorcycle races. Much of the event's popularity is because of the epic motorcycle rides and scenery in the Black Hills that encompasses the mountains and unforgettable destinations like [Devil's Tower](#), [Custer State Park](#), [Mount Rushmore](#) and the [Crazy Horse Memorial](#).

Best RV Parks for Sturgis Rally

If you're thinking of attending Sturgis this year, you'll want to make reservations soon. Where you stay depends on your goals. If you want to be in the middle of the action, visit during the official Sturgis rally dates of August 8th through 14th and book your stay in RV parks close to town like:

Sturgis merchants are known for their hospitality because the town depends on revenue from rally attendees, but keep in mind you'll pay for your RV campsite during Sturgis. Nightly rates are much higher during official rally dates than just before and right after. You're much more likely to find better deals if you book early in the year so don't wait.

Campaign launched to clean up Wicked Campers

February 19, 2016, in International

WELLINGTON, New Zealand — Family First New Zealand has launched a campaign designed to pressure Wicked Campers into removing offensive advertisements and messages on their campers which have been labeled sexist, misogynist and racist.

"Many families have been offended by the offensive signs on Wicked Campers that travel around NZ but have felt powerless to stop them. This campaign will focus on complaints being made to the local Council that the signage breaches the signage bylaws in that area. Based on the experience in Whangarei recently, this could result in a prosecution for a bylaw breach with a penalty up to \$20,000 and an order to cover up the offending material," says Bob McCoskrie, national director of Family First New Zealand.


