President's Corner



Our next event is the Steamboat Rock Rally. Suzie & Bob Toftdahl and Dana & I are hosting the rally at Steamboat Rock State Park on Banks Lake in Eastern Washington near Grand Coulee Dam. In addition to the Visitor Center, there is a Laser Light Show in the evening. The area where the park is located has some geological significance, one being "Dry Falls." Dry Falls is 3.5 miles long with a 400-foot drop caused at the end of the last ice age by catastrophic flooding channeling water at 65 mph through the Upper Grand Coulee and over the fall's rock face.

I plan to have the annual meeting at the rally. Club business will include officer elections and selection of a charity. After the meeting, rally planning will be discussed.

Officer Elections: This year, we are to elect President, Vice President and Treasurer. As of writing this message, we have a volunteer for Treasurer. The election committee has worked to find officers, but no one has expressed interest in President or Vice President. I thank the committee for their hard work contacting everyone. I was asked to stay on as President until we "found" someone. I declined. If I said yes, that would be the easy way and I think I would be president for life. That would be wrong for the club and I have other commitments. We have 40 coaches (about 80 members) in the club and no one is stepping up. Without leadership, the club will fail.

Our club has had a very good rally schedule in the past. The rallies usually include 10 to 15 coaches and everyone enjoys them. Without leadership, though, coordinating the rallies will be difficult to impossible.

In the past, we have discussed club membership. Currently, we require voting members to be CC owners. A couple of years ago, we voted to change the bylaws to allow previous owners to be associate members, but they could not hold office. Maybe it's time to change the bylaws to allow previous CC owners to be full members, or remove the requirement to be, or have been, a CC owner. If we did this, we would have more club members, providing a larger pool for officers. For reference, a full copy of the current bylaws is contained in this issue of the newsletter.

Charity for 2018: For the charity, I plan on submitting the Fisher House Foundations. This foundation helps our military by providing housing close to the hospital when a family member is in the hospital for an extended time. There is a Fisher House at Joint Base Lewis McCord (JBLM) in Tacoma, WA. If we can't find officers, I will recommend that we not have a Charity for 2018.

I would like to see a few more rallies, but that is not a good idea if we don't have officers. What I am writing is disturbing, but needs to be said. At work, we had a saying: "Face Facts Brutally." The fact is that no one is stepping up and the club needs leadership.

Steamboat Rock State Park has great camping facilities, but no GROUP facilities or sign-up protocol. To reserve sites together, we devised the system below and hope that everyone wishing to attend has signed up by now.

To camp in the Washington State Parks, all reservations are made on a first-selected/paid, first-reserved basis.

On the registration form, is a schedule of camping fees and [cancellation penalties](#). It includes all information that is required to make a reservation in the Washington State Park system. Please give Dana a call ([360 876 1196](tel:3608761196)) and she will give you the site information you will need to make your reservation.

Your confirmation and receipt will be sent directly to you via e-mail by the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission. If you are traveling with a buddy, tell us who so we can site you together. Please send a copy of your confirmation to Dana (fdsutt@wavecable.com).

We will have made all reservations in the DUNE CAMP Loop Sites starting with site 81 [for the Rally Host couple] through 89. We would then have gone to sites 91 through 95, then 76 through 80. All of these are in generally close proximity. Making reservations yourselves can be accomplished on line at www.parks.wa.gov or by phone at [888-226-7688](tel:8882267688). Brochures can be downloaded at the website.

We are planning to host several of the meals, so this will be kind of an informal, let's-relax rally. Once you have your site with the park, the club will charge a \$30.00 rally fee. There are sites still available so plan to join us. We will be visiting the Grand Coulee Dam and light show, the Dry Falls area as well as enjoy Banks Lake and the surrounding area. Tenth Anniversary

Happy 10th Anniversary **NorthWest Country Coachers**. Yes, fellow club members, our organization has been in existence for a decade as of September 29, 2017.

The idea for a Northwest region **Country Coach** owner's club started a year or two prior to our becoming an FMCA Chapter. When we Northwest Coach owners attended the annual Class Reunion Rallies organized jointly by Country Coach International and Country Coach Inc., we'd see members of the other regional clubs arriving and parking together for easy interaction among their attendees from previous affiliations. At the August 2007 Class Reunion Rally in Albany, Oregon, Gary Wallstrom, an officer with the Country Coach International club, arranged a meeting room for the purpose of exploring interest in forming a regional **Country Coach** owners club in the Northwest. That meeting was well attended and had strong interest, so the process of forming an FMCA chapter began.

The actual chapter formation meeting was held in late September 2007 in Salem at the Hee Hee Ilahee RV Park. The large number of coaches in attendance was a good indicator that our club would be successful.

The original club officers were: David Roberts, President; Kris Casebeer, Vice President; Mary Ann Storey, Treasurer; Lee Casebeer, Secretary/ Membership person; Don Schleuse, National FMCA Director; Herb Harris, Alternate National FMCA Director; and Barb Lowery, Newsletter Editor. Initially, there were about 50 members. David Roberts had a goal of 100 members within the first year. That was a reasonable goal with **Country Coach Inc.** still producing new coaches each year. Past records are lacking, but we got very close to the 100 member status before **Country Coach Inc.** discontinued making coaches. Our current membership level is a little over 50, so we have maintained the original size of the club without the assistance of new coaches being added to the population.

David had a strong belief that a regularly published newsletter is the "life blood" of an organization. Good communications is the key to success in any

organization. Fortunately, we have had several dedicated Newsletter Editors who have produced informative documents on a regular basis over the 10 years. Thank you to the present and past editors: Barb Lowery, Mary Lou Thun, Teresa Robbins and Terry Apple. Our current editor, Terry, has generated publications through two different time periods. Another key club position is the Treasurer. Wow, that person is always busy taking in members' money for rallies, paying rally deposit fees to resorts hosting our events, keeping the money accounts balanced and reminding members that their membership dues need to be paid. We've had two treasurers, Mary Ann Storey and Dana Suttell. We've had three presidents--David Roberts, Fred Dent and Frank Suttell--who set direction for the club. Don Schleuse has been our National FMCA Director for the entire 10 years. Don is very passionate about FMCA issues and keeps us informed on what is happening at the FMCA national level. Herb Harris was our alternate National FMCA director until Alan Shapiro assumed that position at the last election cycle. Other officers that helped provide direction and policy for our club have been/are Kris Casebeer, Russ Warren, Rod Robbins and Scotty Bliss as Vice Presidents; and Lee Casebeer, Wayne Gable, Candyce Detloff and Sibylle Beck as Secretaries. One particular member, Herb Harris, deserves huge recognition for submitting articles he finds for our Newsletter. Thank you very much, Herb.

Another Thank You, of course, goes to Bob Lee, founder of **Country Coach Inc.**, for his insight and leadership producing our Homes on Wheels that have taken us to far reaches of this amazing country and beyond.

See folks, there have been many who have contributed to the success of our club. Is it time for you to step up and be a board member and help the club's continuation?

NorthWest Country Coachers FMCA Chapter Bylaws

ARTICLE I - CHAPTER NAME

The name of this not-for-profit organization shall be **NorthWest Country Coachers**.

A Chapter of the **Family Motor Coach Association, Inc.**, hereinafter: Chapter and **FMCA**.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

1. **PURPOSE:** This Chapter exists to promote social, recreational, and informational exchange and activities that provide for the enjoyment and pleasurable use of family member coaches.
2. **AREA:** This Chapter shall be authorized to function in the **Northwest Area**.
3. **SCOPE:** This chapter will have members with a mutual interest in the Country Coach Motorhome and/or drawn from the location of the Northwest Area.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERS

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** To be eligible for, and to maintain membership in, the Chapter, a person must be in good standing with **FMCA** and meet the dues requirement and provisions set forth in the Bylaws of this Chapter.

Membership in this Chapter shall not be denied any person because of race, sex, religion, color, marital or family status, age, nationality, or disability.

2. The term "Family-Unit" is defined as a person, his or her spouse or partner, dependents of each regardless of age, and nondependent grandchildren and great-grandchildren age 18 and under.
3. The term "Membership" is defined as either a family unit or an individual or individuals owning a Qualifying Motor Coach who share a membership number.
4. The term "Member" is defined as each adult who, jointly or individually, constitutes a membership. The voting rights of each member are defined in the description of each category.
5. The term "Qualifying Motor Coach" is defined as a self-propelled, completely self-contained vehicle that contains all the conveniences of a home, including cooking, sleeping, and permanent sanitary facilities, in which the driver's area is directly accessible in a walking position from the living quarters manufactured by Country Coach. The terms Motor Coach and Motorhome may be used interchangeably.

6. MEMBERSHIP TYPES

A. Voting Members

Regular Member -- Meets all chapter eligibility requirements and owns a Country Coach at the beginning of the dues year.

Associate -- Met all eligibility criteria when joining the club, has a current membership in FMCA, but no longer owns their Country Coach.

B. Non-Voting Members

Commercial Member -- Membership in this classification is granted by the Board of Directors. Members in this classification must have either a personal FMCA membership or work for a company that maintains a Commercial FMCA membership.

C. Charter Member means each of the initial 41 members who were members of this chapter at the time it obtained the original charter from FMCA. The voting privileges of Charter Members will be consistent with their current membership classification.

7. DUES AND FEES

A. ANNUAL DUES: Annual payment of Chapter and National dues enables persons to become active members entitled to all rights and privileges of the Chapter and FMCA. The annual dues for membership in the Chapter shall be in an amount as the membership shall establish.

B. RENEWAL: Renewal dues from Chapter members become due and payable January 1st.

C. INITIAL APPLICATION: Application for new membership shall be accompanied by payment of annual Chapter and National dues (unless already an FMCA member). If an initial application is accepted after November 1st, the dues shall be regarded as covering the next membership year.

D. INITIATION FEE: New and reinstated members may be required to pay an initiation fee in an amount to be established by the Chapter membership.

E. ARREARS: Any member whose dues remain unpaid for more than 30 days after becoming due shall be considered delinquent; after 90 days, membership is canceled.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

1. DUTIES OF OFFICERS: The duties of elected officers shall be as defined in the Member and Volunteer Handbook.

2. TERMS OF OFFICE: The elected officers of this Chapter shall serve a 2-year term of office, or until their successors are elected, commencing no later than January 1 of the year following their election. The terms of officers shall be staggered such that only half the Board of Directors is replaced each year. Officers shall be elected in the year indicated in the following table:

- A. Even-numbered election years:
Secretary, National Director, Alternate National Director
- B. Odd-numbered election years:
President, Vice President, Treasurer

3. RIGHTS AND LIMITATIONS

- A. A member must own a Qualifying Motor Coach (Motorhome) or at least 1/3 interest in a Qualifying Motor Coach (Motorhome) in order to hold office in this chapter.
- B. An FMCA member may hold no more than two chapter offices simultaneously. A member may hold an office in two chapters; however, he/she may not hold the offices of national director or alternate national director in more than one chapter.
- C. Any member in good standing may be nominated from the floor for any elective office.
- D. Only Full Members, Full Lifetime Members, Life Members, or Honorary Members who have advanced from one of these classes have the right to hold office in this Chapter.
- E. No official or member shall become vested of any right, title to, or interest in, any Chapter property, except as required by law.

4. EXECUTIVE BOARD

- A. The officers of the chapter shall constitute the Executive Board. Each Board member shall have one vote. In the event of a tie vote, the President may decide the vote.
- B. The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the chapter between its business meetings. The Board shall be subject to the orders of the chapter, and none of its acts shall be in conflict with the chapter or FMCA

ARTICLE V - COMMITTEES

- 1. APPOINTMENT:** Committee members and Chairperson (except Nominating Committee) shall be appointed by the President.
- 2. DUTIES:** All committees shall function within the policies of the Chapter and (except Nominating Committee) under the direction of the President. Financial reports, vouchers, and monies due the Chapter shall be submitted on a timely basis.

3. QUORUM: A Committee quorum shall be a simple majority of that committee to be present at that committee meeting in order for that committee to take action and make decisions and recommendations of the Chapter for the task to which they are assigned

ARTICLE VI - CHAPTER ADMINISTRATION

1. AUTHORITY: This Chapter shall be democratically self-governed, deriving its existence and authority from the consent of its membership assembled in meeting or, in certain instances, by mail vote on stated propositions.

2. ORGANIZATIONAL YEAR: The fiscal and membership year of the Chapter shall commence on January 1 and end on December 31.

3. CHAPTER MEETINGS

A. TYPES: The term "meeting" shall include coach rallies, campouts, dinner meetings, and any other gatherings suitable to the function of the Chapter.

B. BUSINESS MEETINGS: In each fiscal year, a chapter shall hold at least one business meeting at which a quorum is present. The meeting can be a gathering in one area or where some or all of the members communicate with other members through electronic means such as the internet or by telephone that allows all members the opportunity for simultaneous aural communication. Said meetings shall be duly announced in advance to the membership, including adequate description of how to participate.

C. ANNUAL ELECTION: Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting to elect new officers, from a list of candidates furnished by the Nominating Committee, to replace those officers whose term of office expires that year. In the event the chapter has more than one meeting during the year, the Annual Meeting shall be the meeting held closest to the end of the calendar year. The voting general membership is to elect Chapter officers, including a President, Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a National Director, and an Alternate National Director as may be required for that year.

In the event a board member cannot fulfill their term of office, the board may appoint a chapter member to complete the remaining term of office.

D. QUORUM: A quorum for the transaction of business at any duly called Chapter meeting is 25% of the Chapter family-unit memberships or 15 family-unit memberships, whichever is less.

E. VOTING: Except as specified elsewhere in these Bylaws, a simple majority vote of F# and L# members in good standing and voting shall be required to approve or disapprove any matter.

The Chapter has established that voting will be one (1) Vote per **FMCA** Number.

Balloting by mail may be undertaken when a proposed matter is voted to be of such importance or urgency that a total membership vote is advisable.

F. PARLIAMENTARY PROCESS: The rules contained in the current edition of **ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER NEWLY REVISED** shall govern this Chapter's proceedings to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of **FMCA** and the Bylaws of this Chapter.

4. MAINTAINING AFFILIATION: This Chapter must maintain a minimum of 15 family-unit memberships.

The Chapter Secretary shall furnish to the National Office of **FMCA**, no later than the last week in December, a membership list, a list of chapter officers, and assurance that one (1) business meeting was held.

5. ANNUAL AUDIT: An annual audit of the Chapter's annual books and records shall be undertaken and reported to the membership.

6. APPLICATION OF NATIONAL CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS: This Chapter accepts and agrees that the Chapter Bylaws shall conform to any mandatory requirements stipulated in the Constitution and Bylaws of **FMCA**.

ARTICLE VII - ELECTIONS

1. NOMINATING COMMITTEE COMPOSITION:

A. The Nominating Committee shall consist of not less than three (3) Chapter members in good standing nominated and elected yearly by the Chapter membership.

B. Election of an individual to the Nominating Committee shall not prohibit that person from being nominated for elected office.

2. NOMINATING COMMITTEE DUTIES:

A. To select one of its members as Nominating Committee Chairman.

B. To nominate candidates for the Chapter Offices of President, Vice President(s), Secretary, Treasurer, National Director, and Alternate National Director, and three (3) members for the Nominating Committee for the new term, to be presented for voting by the Chapter membership.

C. To obtain clear acceptance of the nominees to serve the Chapter should they be elected.

D. To make certain that nominated candidates are members in good standing and qualified under applicable National and Chapter bylaws.

E. To nominate candidates to fill vacancies that occur in elected Chapter offices.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

1. **MANDATORY AMENDMENTS:** National Bylaw Amendments applicable to Chapter operations shall automatically be adopted by the Chapter and are not subject to a vote by the Chapter membership.
2. **AMENDING PROCEDURE:** These Bylaws may be amended by a 65% affirmative vote of the members present and voting at a duly called meeting, providing that prior notice of at least 30 days has been given of the proposition(s) to amend.
 - A. Any member of the Chapter may propose amendments to the Bylaws.
 - B. Approved amendments to these Bylaws become effective immediately upon their adoption, or at such time as specified in the amendment.
3. **DISTRIBUTION:** Copies of changes, additions, amendments, or revisions to these Bylaws shall be forwarded to the National Office and to the National Area Vice President.

ARTICLE IX - LIQUIDATION AND DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of this Chapter of FMCA by majority vote of the chapter, all of the remaining assets of the Chapter shall be contributed to the purpose(s) for which the Chapter is organized, or to a qualified nonprofit charity or charities.

Asleep at the wheel

In case you missed this a couple of weeks ago, a semi-truck driver has been charged with inattention and following too closely in **Washington state**. The driver came out of his daze in time to see a BMW sedan, dead ahead, stopped for left-turning traffic on tourist-heavy Highway 101 near Quilcene. Quickly spinning the wheel, he headed into the oncoming traffic lane — occupied by a Class A motorhome piloted by a New Mexico man. The RVer tried to get out of the way and ended up rolling the coach, with himself and two passengers ending up in the hospital. The semi-snoozer yanked it back into the right lane, and mashed the Beemer.



Burn Bans There is an **outdoor burn ban in northwest Washington state** as of Friday. “The ban applies to all outdoor burning, including recreation fires on state forests, state parks and forestlands under DNR fire protection within Whatcom, Skagit, Snohomish, Island and San Juan counties,” the Washington State Department of Natural Resources said in a news release. “This ban also includes all outdoor fires on improved lands under county jurisdiction.” Fires powered by gas or propane stoves are allowed during this ban, it said. Campfire restrictions for **Olympic National Park** and Olympic National Forest in Washington state are in effect as of Friday, but gas camp stoves are allowed. Also effective Friday, campfires or the ignition of anything other than stoves or grills solely fueled by liquid petroleum fuels are banned in all portions of the **North Cascades National Park Service Complex**.

At the NWCC Rally in Southern Oregon in July of 2016, attendees were privileged to see some of the “behind-the-scenes” activities at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival (OSF). Besides seeing a play (THE WIZ) in the outdoor theatre, there was a Backstage Tour of all three theaters and an exclusive tour of the new Production Building where the costumes are stored and all the sets are made.
