Please consider helping with our Newsletter. We use Microsoft Publisher to produce the Newsletter but if you are familiar with Microsoft Word learning Publisher won't be too difficult. If you are curious or interested call or Email Teresa to find out more (contact information is listed in the Officer Contact List).

Web Site: Our chapter web site has been upgraded to facilitate the transition to the new Board and to take care of some housekeeping tasks that were deferred from last year to this year. Much of what was back office, behind the scenes things to make our site more secure and to date links to our new officers. You will notice that the web site has a slightly different, new look and has been reorganized a bit. The Newsletter is now posted so you can read it online if you click on Newsletter. If you want to download the current issue or any issue from our archives, then click on Newsletter Archives on the Newsletter drop down. Similarly, you can now view the chapter Bylaws and the Service Directory on line. Coming soon will be a download link for the chapter Bylaws. The current Service Directory is part of the monthly Newsletter so if you need a copy on your computer just download the current Newsletter.

The site has also been optimized to work better on tablets and smartphones. I'm still working on the web site but please look it over and send me any feedback or suggestions (I know that the Store page is blank right now but the drop-down links work fine).

Our site is now encrypted with SSL and has a new PayPal interface. These two upgrades make using our online forms and payments more secure like you expect anywhere else shopping on the web. That said you are cautioned to always use a secure connection to the internet (either directly connected to your modem or you must enter a password to connect wirelessly).

What we did (the techie stuff): The first task completed was to increase our site security. We reviewed all our security settings, enhanced them where we could and added over all security with an SSL certificate. I know, what is an SSL certificate? Simply stated an SSL encrypts all data that moves between your computer and our site. That means credit card transactions, data entered on forms (like contact us) are safe and secure even if you are on a public network. That said, public networks are not as secure as encrypted connections (if you must log on with a password to a WiFi network you are relatively safe on an encrypted network). You will know you are on an SSL encrypted site by looking at the URL address bar in your browser. A green padlock should appear to the left of the address and the URL now starts with **https://** instead of **http://** (no s). All this in the realm of who cares, too techie for me. I get it, it is a little techie. But you should care about the bottom line; you can now use our online registration and dues portals safely and securely.

Our credit card system has also been enhanced so it is more secure and cheaper for us overall. Our site is now a merchant account with PayPal which means we no longer rely on a third part processor who charges an additional monthly fee. We pay one, low, annual fee plus the customary transaction charges from PayPal.

The web site is still being revised and reorganized with an eye towards updating the whole site later this year just because we can! (and because it has been nearly 5 years since it was last revamped). We use Wordpress which means the site is always live, that is changes and mistakes we make appear immediately. So, if you notice something awry give it a few minutes and try again. If it persists, please let me know.



Army Fisher House Foundation at Joint Base Lewis & McCord (JBLM) in Tacoma WA

The Fisher House Foundation is best known for a network of comfort homes where military and veterans' families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment.

Madigan Army Medical Center has a full spectrum of specialty and subspecialty services for adult and pediatric patients to include Developmental Pediatrics, Perinatology Fellowship, Hematology/Oncology, NICU, and Radiation Therapy.

Our mission is to provide our military members and their families a comfortable, nurturing and secure environment while they receive medical care at Madigan Army Medical Center (MAMC).

Fisher House Information: The Fisher House is located about one half mile from MAMC. The house provides seven family rooms with private bathrooms, TV/DVD, WiFi, telephone and computers. The house has a living room, dining room and kitchen; these common areas are shared by all families. The FH will provide most amenities to include toiletries, towels, linens, **high chairs, booster seats, futons, "pack and plays"**. Families are responsible for their meals and the kitchen is well furnished with the items needed for food preparation. Each family will have some refrigerator and freezer space plus a cabinet for their food. Laundry area and detergent are provided.

Eligibility and Cost: Fisher Houses prioritizes their rooms according to the severity of the medical condition. All active duty, retired military and military family members who live at least 40 miles away from the medical center are eligible. Referral can be made in advance; however, that does not guarantee placement into the FH. There is no charge to stay at the FH and demand for our rooms is high; because of this, families should make a back-up plan and be prepared to stay in a local hotel (average \$125 a night).

The Fisher House receives a significant portion of their funding through charitable contributions. Our donations come from individuals, spouses' clubs, military organizations, and chapel designated offerings. The Fisher house operates as a Non-Appropriated Fund Instrumentality (NAFI) of the United States Army. Donations made to the Fisher House are tax deductible.
