Plans are well under way for our MAY 3-6 gathering at the Silver Spur RV Park in Silverton, Oregon. Here's a preview to whet your appetite and give you the motivation to register for the event. We have 15 spaces reserved and we have exclusive use of the club house for the duration of our stay. **FOR THIS RALLY, YOU WILL REGISTER DIRECTLY WITH THE PARK.** Please call the park (rather than reserving online) and tell them that you are with NWCC. Sites are \$46.00 per night to be paid in full at the time of registration. (The reservation fee is refundable, except for a \$10.00 fee upon greater than 24-hour cancellation or a first night charge upon less than 24 hours.)

Rally fees are \$30.00 per coach (does NOT include dinner at Garden View Restaurant on Friday)

Thursday arrivals will have a BYOB and "LIGHT" bring-an-appetizer-to-share-Meet-n-Greet followed by a yet to be determined meal prepared by your hosts.

Friday morning you will find fruit, juices, croissants and muffins available in the club house when you're ready to start your day (BYO coffee/tea). That'll be a great time to arrange carpools for those who want to share an adventure and to arrange rides for heading up the hill for our evening out at Garden View Restaurant where we have reservations for 30. It's a lovely restaurant that overlooks the Oregon Garden and you can preview some of their menu at: <https://locu.com/places/the-garden-view-restaurant-oregon-garden-resort-silverton-us/#menu>

Saturday breakfast will be in the main lodge and is "Park" wide for a \$7.00 fee payable when you register, and that evening we have the park BBQs for grilling the protein of your choice. Please bring a vegetable or salad to share. Dessert will be provided by your hosts.

Friday and Saturday are days for exploring or just kicking back and visiting. For those of you who love flowers, save some room in your summer landscape (and your coach) for a hanging basket (or 2 or 3), some potted plants or even some veggies because many of us will be making a pilgrimage to Godfrey's to stock up. Then there's the Willamette Valley Fruit Company for bags of berries and or pies, der Glockenspiel for lunch, The Oregon Garden, Frank Lloyd Wright House, Silver Creek Falls, and, of course, shop-hopping' the streets of downtown Silverton. Woodburn and the outlet Mall are a few minutes' drive and Salem is just a few minutes in the other direction.

SUNDAY we'll say our good-byes over Vern's Cinnamon Rolls, fruit, juice and your own favorite beverage (and any left-overs that might be needing to be used up).

There is a lot to do in the area; antique shops galore; alpaca farms; a pie factory nearby; a fantastic floral/veggie nursery a short drive from the Park; The Oregon Gardens and the Frank Lloyd Wright House are close and for the really adventurous, a trek around Silver Creek Falls will provide plenty of exercise.

The weekend we have reserved is during the Bottles Brew and BBQ annual event. BBQ Restaurants from around the country will be in town competing. Saturday is the festival day from 10 AM to 6 PM filled with food and entertainment. You may purchase discounts tickets for Saturday when you register for the rally.



"This is a 21+ event featuring Prosser wineries, breweries, live music and a juried BBQ competition hosted by the Pacific Northwest Barbecue Association. Arrive early to check out the BBQ competition - watch (and smell) the competition first hand. Samples are available from the BBQ teams for purchase- first come basis. Stay later to enjoy the live-music entertainment and sample beer and wine from area producers. Additional food available by a wide assortment of vendors." Quoted from the event web site.

You may purchase a discounted General Admission ticket for Bottles Brews & BBQ through NWCC when you register for the rally (\$20 day of at the gate). Admission includes access to all the venues and entertainment. Food and beverages are available from the venue using their Token system (\$10 or \$20 bundles). There will also be food and beverage trucks in the event area that will take cash or credit/debit cards but not the event tokens. For more information click on the event logo above.

Saturday - Bottles Brew and BBQ in town 10AM - 6 PM - No host group dinner out or on your own

Sunday - "Breaking Up is Hard to Do" NWCC hosted Continental Breakfast before going home

To register for this rally please register directly with the park first by calling 509/786-4969. Tell them you are with NWCC and then choose your site number. You will need to make a \$45 first night deposit to confirm your reservation (there are three premium sites in our reserved block for \$55 a night). All of the park sites that can accommodate our coaches are currently reserved except for our block of sites. When our sites are gone that's it, there are no other sites available. There is an extensive cancellation waiting list already so make your reservations now before all the sites are gone.

After you have made your park registration register with NWCC to pay your \$40 registration fee (includes two people; Single occupant \$25) which includes the Meet and Greet on Thursday, Friday Dinner and Sunday Continental Breakfast. There is wine tasting at the RV Park Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings from 5:30 – 7:00. The first night is \$6 and includes a souvenir wine glass.

Show your glass the next night and wine tasting is just \$3. You may prepay to participate in the wine tasting when you register. You may register online from our web site <https://nwccers.org> and click on the Yakima Valley Wine Country Rally link on the right-hand sidebar or use the registration form in this newsletter.

All Sites are minimum 55' pull throughs with Full 50 Amp Hookups.

There is a lot to do and see in the beautiful Yakima Valley, this highly rated park is located right next to Vintner's Village (where the Bottles Brew and BBQ is held) in downtown Prosser, there are a number of small wineries and tasting rooms in the Village all within walking distance from the park.



Michele and I, like many RV owners, were contemplating taking weeklong and weekend trips when we purchased our rig. We also had two longer thoughts in mind to spend extended trips exploring the Oregon Trail between St. Joe, Missouri and Oregon and exploring the Mississippi River from its headwaters to the Gulf of Mexico. We weren't both retired for a number of years so our thoughts gravitated to the shorter versions. Once Michele retired, thoughts of longer trips emerged and then, bingo the Canadian Maritimes captivated our imaginations. All kinds of concerns came to mind about being away from our home base, family and local friends for many weeks and encouraged us to take a shortened look at an RV trip clear across the country. Where would we get repairs to our coach if we needed them? What if we had an accident? Yada, yada, yada. With our son and daughter-in-law coming up between apartment leases and willing to move into our home we hit the go button and planned a four month trip east to spend some extended time in the Canadian Maritimes and places in between. On May first we loaded up the coach and our two dashboard girls, our two rescue terriers Chaco and Jesse and headed down the road. Not everyone can take a four-month hiatus from home, but we felt going long would allow us to spend quality time in the Provinces and get to know the country and the people. We couldn't have been more spot on.

Once on the road we began a travel blog to document our trip so we could share it with friends as we went along. We both shared the descriptions of our travels and Michele organized the layout of photos and maps so dozens of our friends and family could "ride along". How we got all of them in our coach is still a mystery, but they told us they felt like they were enjoying every mile, every location and every event with us day-by-day. We met many Canadians who had not traveled as extensively as we did throughout the Maritimes, even within their home Provinces. Army Fisher House Foundation at Joint Base Lewis & McCord (JBLM) in Tacoma WA

The Fisher House Foundation is best known for a network of comfort homes where military and veterans' families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment.

Madigan Army Medical Center has a full spectrum of specialty and subspecialty services for adult and pediatric patients to include Developmental Pediatrics, Perinatology Fellowship, Hematology/Oncology, NICU, and Radiation Therapy.

Our mission is to provide our military members and their families a comfortable, nurturing and secure environment while they receive medical care at Madigan Army Medical Center (MAMC).

Fisher House Information: The Fisher House is located about one half mile from MAMC. The house provides seven family rooms with private bathrooms, TV/DVD, Wi-Fi, telephone and computers. The house has a living room, dining room and kitchen; these common areas are shared by all families. The FH will provide most amenities to include toiletries, towels, linens, high chairs, booster seats, futons, "pack and plays". Families are responsible for their meals and the kitchen is well furnished with the items needed for food preparation. Each family will have some refrigerator and freezer space plus a cabinet for their food. Laundry area and detergent are provided.

Eligibility and Cost: Fisher Houses prioritizes their rooms according to the severity of the medical condition. All active duty, retired military and military family members who live at least 40 miles away from the medical center are eligible. Referral can be made in advance; however, that does not guarantee placement into the FH. There is no charge to stay at the FH and demand for our rooms is high; because of this, families should make a back-up plan and be prepared to stay in a local hotel (average \$125 a night).

The Fisher House receives a significant portion of their funding through charitable contributions. Our donations come from individuals, spouses' clubs, military organizations, and chapel designated offerings. The Fisher house operates as a Non-Appropriated Fund Instrumentality (NAFI) of the United States Army. Donations made to the Fisher House are tax deductible.
